This is an update on the status of roadway and drainage construction on Concord Street.

Pennsylvania American Water Company (PAWC) has begun replacing the water main on Concord Street from West 9th Avenue to West 11th Avenue as well as associated water service connections from the main to curb stop. They anticipate this work will continue through the end of January. Following completion of the water main replacement and subject to weather conditions, storm sewer and road reconstruction work is tentatively scheduled to resume by March.

The following is a reminder from the last update:

Concord Street will remain closed to all traffic until at least mid-April from West 9th Avenue to West 11th Avenue during the course of the water main replacement, winter season, and completion of the road reconstruction. Parking and driveway access will not be available along these blocks of Concord Street during this time. Vehicles will need to continue to be parked along Charles Street and Madison Street. We again recognize that parking is limited, so we sincerely appreciate your cooperation.

Trash and recycling collections between West 9th Avenue and West 11th Avenue will continue to occur along Charles Street and Madison Street until Concord Street reopens. Please note that trash and recycling cans must be placed within easy reach of the collection crew along the edge of the street. Cans may be placed on the sidewalk and curb on collection days to accommodate ease of access from the street. Any cans that are placed behind fences or not placed within easy reach from the street will not be collected. Cans must be removed from the sidewalk and other public walkways during non-collection days.

We will then have the appropriate personnel respond to your call. We recognize that the unexpected extended closure presents an inconvenience; however, it will result in an additional significant infrastructure upgrade.
